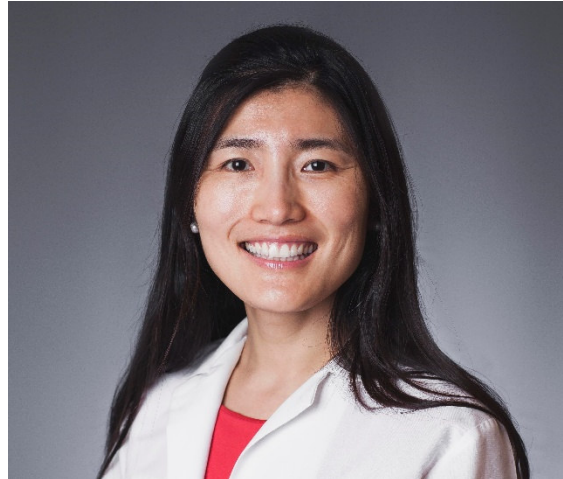


Dr. Yuri Kim



Dr. Yuri Kim is Associate Physician at Brigham and Women's Hospital and Assistant Professor of Medicine at Harvard Medical School in Boston, MA, United States. Dr. Kim graduated summa cum laude from Korea Advanced Institute of Science and Technology, received PhD in Genetics and Development under mentorship of Dr. Eric Olson at UT Southwestern Medical Center, then received MD from Stanford University. She completed internal medicine residency at Brigham and Women's Hospital, cardiovascular medicine fellowship and advanced heart failure and transplant cardiology fellowship at Massachusetts General Hospital. Dr. Kim gained further expertise in cardiovascular genetics research while pursuing postdoctoral research training with Drs. Cricket and Jonathan Seidman at Harvard Medical School.

As a physician-scientist, Dr. Kim provides clinical care to patients with advanced heart failure and genetic cardiomyopathies. Scientifically, Dr. Kim's research laboratory focuses on studying genetic and molecular mechanisms of cardiomyopathy with a goal of developing therapeutic strategies for heart failure.
