Transcripts of records	Students must attend at least 85% of classes to be admitted to examinations. The Transcript of Records will be sent to the international office of the home university or the student once the academic cycle has ended.
Language of instruction	All classes and exams take place in German.
Language requirements	A German level of B2 (CEFR) is required at the start of the semester. A proof of a minimum level of B1 must be provided with the application documents by 31 May.

Medical insurance requirements	Students from EU countries can keep their foreign health insurance if they have been issued a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Accommodation	There are limited rooms in dormitories reserved for exchange students. The application form is available on our website.
Semester contribution	The reduced semester contribution (<i>Semesterbeitrag</i>) for exchange students amounts to approx. €330 and is not the same as tuition fees.
